Meeting Highlights:

- Corresponding Secretary's Report: Several cards sent; there is a new New Member Guide; Dance Around the World Nov. 23, 2024.
- Treasurer's Report: Current balance in the general fund is \$7634, the Scholarship Fund has \$2298. Due to increased bank fees, the scholarship fund is now combined into the checking account.

THE NEW DANCE

Guess who's written a brand new dance, With a brand new figure in it, Not easy to learn – but worth a try, As you'll hear, if you give me a minute.

It is, of course, a "meanwhile" dance And sounds, perhaps, complex, But it's quite straightforward as long as you know Your number, your partner, and sex.

Threes and fours on the opposite side – You'll find it better that way. You've curtsied and bowed, so now get set And cross your fingers and pray!

An inverted rondel is how it begins And then the new figure you'll see With simple instructions on sheets 1 and 2 And diagrams 1, 2 and 3.

Two highland settings, a knotted barette, And end in the form of a square. Crossing reels, look behind you, and with any luck You'll find that your partner is there. Your partner is there, but
ignore him or her,
The pattern now subtly alters —
You grab someone
else and all promenade round
Backwards — but only three quarters.

The Mic-Mac Rotary bit comes next, You loop and you loop again, A quadruple figure of eight, and then A five-and-a-half-bar chain.

A two-and-a-half-bar turn ends the dance, An experience no one should miss. Wherever, whenever, whatever you've danced You've never met something like this!

I hope you enjoy it – I think that you will – And I do hope you think it's alright
To give you this preview of what he might dream
When he's having a very bad night!

OC BRANCH SCHOLARSHIPS Revised 2020

The Branch has established a scholarship fund to encourage the development of Scottish Country Dancing teachers, dancers, and musicians in Orange

County, and to provide opportunities for Southern California Scottish Country Dancing dancers to experience high quality live music both as listeners and as dancers.

To be eligible for a dance scholarship, the applicant must be a current member of the Orange County

Branch and be presently attending class regularly for at least one year. Preference will be given to applicants interested in pursuing teacher training.

To be eligible for a musician scholarship, the applicant must be a resident of Southern California, have demonstrated an interest in playing Scottish Country Dancing music, and should play an instrument relevant to Scottish Country Dancing, such as accordion, fiddle, keyboard, piano, recorder, etc.

Applications are available on the branch website and at branch dance classes. Applicants must provide information on how the funds will be used and will need to provide documentation of attendance. Requests must be received at least 30 days before the funds are needed. Awards will be limited to a total of \$500 a year. Requests and awards will be confidential. Scholarships will be granted without attention to race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, color, nationality, ancestry, age, or place of origin.

The dance scholarship is in honor of Orange County Branch founding member and long-time dancer Dorothy Craik. The musician scholarship is in honor of Andrew Rankine, a noted accordionist, composer and renowned Scottish Country Dancing band leader.
